## Exterior

Bright **LED headlights** with auto-on/off are standard on every Odyssey

LED headlights can't be found on any Pacifica

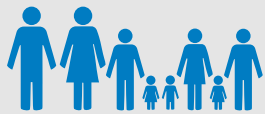
Odyssey LX, EX and EX-L feature 18-inch wheels, increasing to 19 inches on Touring and Elite

All Pacifica Touring trims feature 17-inch wheels and jump to 18 inches on the Limited (and 20 inches on the more expensive Red S Edition and 35th Anniversary Limited)

On Odyssey EX-L and above, a **power moonroof** is standard

On Touring trims, a power moonroof is a \$1,295 option—and on Pacifica Limited and Red S Edition, it's a \$495 option

## Interior



Odyssey can seat 8 adults standard in EX and above trims

Pacifica offers an eighth seat as a pricey \$595 option on lower trims—and \$495 on the Limited

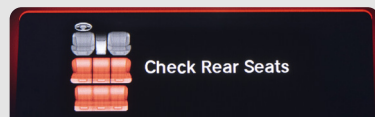

**The Verdict:** The Honda Odyssey is the clear choice over the Pacifica when it comes to overall value:



- Safety and driver-assistive features not standard on Pacifica
- Technology features standard on Odyssey not found on Pacifica
- Larger maximum cargo volume<sup>1</sup>
- Much higher residual value after 36 and 60 months of purchase
